Now in their 14th year, WVFFV equipped more than 2500 veterans in all 50 states with tools, trucks, tractors, farm machinery, forklifts, electronics, drones and more valued in excess of \$3.5 Million!

Often the equipment is adapted to accommodate combat injuries like loss of limbs or traumatic brain injury (TBI), like the tinted glass cab over a tractor to prevent headaches for a Pennsylvania Marine who sustained TBI and spinal injuries on his 5th deployment to Iraq and Afghanistan.

WVFFV also makes awards to veteran-serving nonprofits for needed equipment for programs designed for veterans with disabilities or severe PTSD like the equine therapy program V.E.T.S. of Stonington, CT.

**Work Vessels for Vets** achieves these remarkable results through collaborations, shared resources, partnerships with other funders, and clever negotiations with suppliers. We cajole sellers to offer in-kind, tax-deductible donations or deep discounts. We leverage cash donations to the maximum. **BMC Craig McCalister, USCG (ret)** of New London, CT came to WVFFV with a dream of establishing Veteran Equine Therapy Services (V.E.T.S.) in eastern Connecticut. Motivated to support injured veterans who struggle with thoughts of suicide or who cope with disabling conditions, Craig and his co-founders Christina Clark & Thor Torgerson (pictured) received a WVFFV award of computers and funds for training programs to get started in 2016. Since then, V.E.T.S. CT has grown to serve veterans throughout the region, and established a farm in Stonington, CT.

V.E.T.S. provides a serene place for military veterans, at no charge, to benefit from therapeutic healing through equine-related activities by highly skilled instructors, staff and trained volunteers. Many volunteers and staff are veterans themselves who understand the challenges veterans face reintegrating into domestic life after experiencing the psychological trauma and physical wounds of military service.

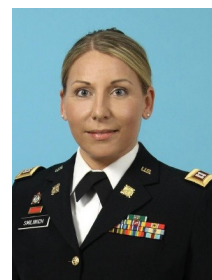

## Meet our Easterseals VRP Ambassador



**Major Sonja S. Smilinich, USA, Retired**, was sworn into the Connecticut National Guard in July of 1998. She attended Basic Training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO and her first assignment was with Troop Medical Clinic as a medic. She progressed to the rank of SGT before enrolling in Officer Candidate School (OCS) in 2005. She was commissioned as a second lieutenant on 30 April 2007 and assigned as the Maintenance Control

Officer with A Co 1920d Engineers. In December 2009 she volunteered to deploy with the 169h Aviation Regiment as the S1 (Administrative Officer) in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Following her deployment from August 2009 to August 2010, she returned to A Co, 192d Engineers as the Maintenance Control Officer and was then selected to command A Co. She was promoted to Captain during her command of A Co, she was then transferred to the 143rd Regional Support Group and selected for rear detachment command while the 143rd deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Resolute Support. Following her second command she was transferred to the 143rd Combat Sustainment Support Battalion to serve as Battalion Ammunition Officer in the Support Operations Section, and shortly after assigned as Battalion S-4 (Logistics Officer). Sonja's final assignment was JFHQ SARC, helping victims of sexual assault and providing refresher training to Unit Victim Advocates and units for the Connecticut National Guard.

Her civilian career began as a Connecticut Army National Guard Federal Technician in 2002, and promoted to Lead Staffer at the Connecticut National Guard Human Resources Office in Middletown. She was then promoted in December 2015 to a Human Resources position with Department of Navy, Naval Sea Systems Command and now works for Supervisor of Shipbuilding in Groton as the Corporate Business Operations Director and Administrative Department Head responsible for providing a variety of essential management functions in Human Resources, Manpower Management and Workforce Development. She has served as the SSGR Command Diversity Council Chairperson, and volunteers time with the Federally Employed Women (FEW) and Women in Defense (WID) organizations. She holds a 200 RYT certification from Recovery Yoga and Baptiste Power Yoga Level One credential, has instructed at Zen and Now wellness studio in Niantic, and now teaches Yoga and Mindfulness Meditation at Veterans Rally Point to Veterans and their families. Sonja holds a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration, and a Master's Degree in Organizational Management from Eastern Connecticut State University. She is married to Scott Smilinich and they reside in Oakdale with their dogs Alfred and Archer.
